
Information

HOW CAN I CONTRIBUTE TO WASHwatch.org?

Share your knowledge

- The site has no research or management team. It relies on YOU to share your knowledge and understanding.

Anyone can add to the site to inform the analysis—as much or as little as you are able.

Comment on the data

- Have you read some analysis that doesn't seem right to you?
- Do you work with the government and feel that your progress is not recognised?
- Or are you a campaigner who feels that the analysis flatters the government?

Start a discussion

- Even if you agree with the scoring, there may be questions you want to raise.
- There may be a subtle distinction that isn't captured in the boxes.

Add your comments to the data, make your case, and the quality of the analysis will be constantly refined.

Start a discussion, and engage with fellow WASH sector workers to help influence change.
